

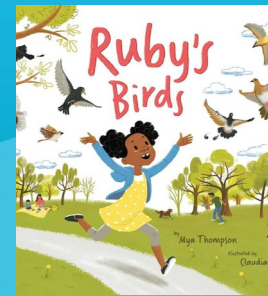

## INVESTIGATION CARD

Take your **journal** and **binoculars** on a walk through your neighborhood. Draw or write in your **journal** some of the things you observe that a bird would need on its journey (food, water, shelter). Use your **binoculars** to look for birds. Use the bird scavenger hunt to see how many birds you see. Want to help birds in your neighborhood? Follow the QR code to the Cornell Lab of Ornithology website and participate in a real citizen science program! The Cornell Lab needs your help to collect data on birds and anyone can do it! This project seeks to introduce kids of all ages and backgrounds to the world of birding. All you have to do is go outside, fill out a data sheet or create your own in your journal. 10 minutes is all it takes to complete this survey then you upload your data to the website which allows scientists to analyze it for their research!
