

Get outside! Take a hike on a trail and use the **wildflower book** to try to identify flowers you see along the way.

Remember, just like Fox, don't pick the flowers, let them keep growing for others to enjoy. Find a flower that inspires you, and study every detail. Look at Fox's drawing of the Golden Glow and take note of the parts of the flower (leaf, stem, petals, sepals, pistil, and stamen). Can you find those parts on your flower? Use your **magnifying glass** if needed. Get a good look at the pistil and stamen. The stamen produces pollen, do you see any pollen? Pollen gets deposited by pollinators onto the top of the sticky pistil. Has this flower been pollinated? Now, create a drawing in your **journal** of your flower with as much detail as you can, and label its parts.
