


In Ohio we have birds that stay year round and birds that travel to other parts of the world for part of the year. We call this travel migration. Some birds come to Ohio in the summer to build nests and raise families and then fly south in the fall. Others breed up north and fly south to Ohio to spend the winter! Migration can be a very perilous journey. In the book a family makes a habitat in their yard to help migrant birds get enough food and rest on their journey. Take your **journal** and **binoculars** on a walk through your neighborhood. Draw or write in your journal some of the things you observe that a bird would need on its journey (food, water, shelter). Use your **binoculars** to look for birds. Use the **bird scavenger hunt** to see how many migrants and resident birds you see. Want to help birds in your neighborhood? Make seed bombs to plant, just scan the QR code for instructions!
